

1. Was flooding of the Fantine previously experienced in this area? If so, when?

Yes, substantial flooding occurred during Hurricane Irene (2011) and this is when the flood protection system was compromised and afterward decertified by FEMA. The Fantine Kill has also substantially flooded during the year of 2009 during Hurricane Bill.

2. What is the freeboard wall constructed of?

There is 2,590 feet of levy and 214 feet of masonry floodwall.

3. What mapping of the creek (hydrologic, topographic, boundary) is available?

Currently there are topographic and flood profile maps provided by FEMA.

4. Should we assume a survey of the creek and surrounding bank will be required?

Yes.

5. Are any property acquisition or easements (temporary or permanent) expected?

At this time none are expected as the area along and adjacent to the Fantine Kill is wholly municipality-owned land.

6. Was a preliminary drainage study or flood study performed? If so, will it be made available?
